

## **Wymeswold C of E Primary School Sports Premium Report**

The Sports Premium is government funding

The allocation of Sports premium is currently (2020 - 2021) £17,080.

This report is a summary of how the sports premium payment was spent and the impact it has had on progress for these pupils.

### **How to use the PE and sport premium**

Schools must use the funding to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport they offer.

This means that you should use the premium to:

- develop or add to the PE and sport activities that your school already offers
- make improvements now that will benefit pupils joining the school in future years

For example, you can use your funding to:

- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with training or resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively
- introduce new sports or activities and encourage more pupils to take up sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and [Change4Life](#) clubs
- run sport competitions
- increase pupils' participation in the [School Games](#)
- run sports activities with other schools

You should not use your funding to:

- employ coaches or specialist teachers to cover planning preparation and assessment (PPA) arrangements - these should come out of your core staffing budgets
- teach the minimum requirements of the national curriculum - including those specified for swimming (or, in the case of academies and free schools, to teach your existing PE curriculum)
