<p>Goods and Services Think about how, over a period of a week, different goods and services get to you. Keep a diary for a week detailing them. E.g. Day 1: Walked to shop for milk and bread. Water from tap. Electricity from mains supply for lighting and TV/Computer. Petrol from petrol station in Burton-on-the-Wolds. Text message from friend. News reports on TV. Gas from mains supply for heating and to cook. Day 2: Drove to supermarket in Loughborough for food. Etc.</p>	<p>How has Benin changed? Paint or draw two images showing an aspect of life in ancient and modern Benin. Write at least one paragraph explaining the changes.</p>	<p>Benin Comparison Draw a picture showing life in England and a picture showing life in Benin. Label and similarities and/or differences.</p>	<p>Electricity Electrical power lines come into your house through an electricity meter. The energy company uses meters to measure how much electricity has been used. This is measured in kilowatt hours (kWh). At home, with an adult, take readings from your meter for a week and record the numbers in a table – Day, Reading (kWh), Number of units used (today’s reading- yesterday’s reading), Cost per unit, Cost of electricity used.</p>

Find an ancient Benin artefact and create a unique piece of artwork inspired by it</p>	<p>Clothing Draw and label a picture of a man and woman wearing traditional clothes from Benin.</p>	<p>Poster of location and environment. Create a poster showing where Benin is and about the environment in and around Benin City. Identify environmental and physical features including forest, savannah, mountains, rivers, oceans from a map. Use information from the map to ask and answer questions, e.g. Why is location important to the development of different types and sizes of settlement?</p>	<p>Benin art diagram. Create a labelled diagram to show the stages in producing a piece of Benin art e.g. from mine to finished piece.</p>
<p>Compare Yourself Print off pictures of yourself as a baby and one of you now. List the similarities and differences of you then and now. Include how you looked, what you ate, what you could do and what you needed.</p>	<p>Timeline. Create your own timeline of Benin’s history, highlighting key events.</p>	<p>Research Project: Research and create an information poster or booklet on your favourite animal. In your projects you should include: The group which the animal belongs to and the features that you use to classify them. The animal’s life cycle. Where the animal lives (habitat). What the animal likes to eat (omnivore, carnivore or herbivore). The features that the animal has to help it survive. You should also include some other interesting facts about your animal.</p>
